History – Walt (2013) and Dean (2007) The meeting to continue camp

\*Safety – trees and Dining Hall/Girl's Dorm – our first charge to accomplish

A Tour from South to North – 2014 to 2025\*

Survey of the property - 2014

\*The current camp sign – Dick Sass donated a Cedar slab, Oroville folks had the sign made

Sprinklers on the south field and Eastside RV Park

\*RV Restrooms – started as an Arlington Project but soon went beyond our scope – Chester

Water system – State Health department standards – Chester

Under the Road water line – Chester

Dining Hall roof – We needed a roofing contractor. I sent 3 requests for bids and got one answer from Zaga Roofing. This roofer was known to some board members and highly recommended by them. From receiving the bid to finished roof was three weeks.

Lean-to – south side of Dining Hall – Arlington wanted something to challenge their skills. Original plan was 16 x 24 but expanded after the old lean-to was torn down. 16'x40'

Arc Construction was hired to put in the slab and the pier blocks. The basic structure was put up in 2 days. Roof rafters were 2" by 12"x 18" to the pony wall and 8 feet to the building. After the work weekend Arc Construction was hired to complete the shear walls and enclose the area.

Power drop – dining hall – Chester

\*West (new) Cabins – an Arlington project – one a year for four years

\*Tabernacle – from enclosed building to Open Air building. This has opened up the grounds. The old building separated the grounds.

\*Siding on North Cabins – begun by Arlington and Oroville – finished by Steve and Carla Muelhausen from Omak

\*Nursery – this was a project. Walls were firred out for insulation, it was sheetrocked and attic insulation blown in. The ramp was re-done twice. A good summertime cabin and nursery during family camp.

\*North end RV Park and power drop – Chester

## Planning Meeting

At our recent planning meeting, we discussed all the projects that need to be done to continue upgrading the structures on the grounds, tried to prioritize what to do next and discussed our Mission Statement. We decided that getting the kitchen remodeled would help us to be more attractive to other groups who have expressed an interest in renting the grounds, so that is our current priority. We also need to get the tractor shed replaced before it collapses and rewire the north end of camp so we have reliable electricity in those cabins.

We plan to continue to upgrade and replace cabins, refurbish the bathrooms by the office and replace the old barn with storage and classroom space. The goal is to have every structure refurbished or replaced so that camp is more attractive and functional for our family camp and for other groups to rent.

At this time we have \$22,375. in checking and \$24,605. in savings for a total of \$46,980. We will not be able to proceed with the kitchen until we have more available funding. Any size donation will be welcomed. And above all, please pray for the Directors and Officers, the camp facility and the funding for the projects.
