Current Projects of Conconully Bible Camp

Conconully Bible Camp (CBC) has been in existence 102 years. In that time there have been many people who have supported the camp. That was so long ago that we no longer remember them but they passed on to us the generational blessings of their faith and we honor them by continuing the evangelistic work of the camp. We believe in the work of salvation and that the Lord brings to the campground every year those who need to know him and those who want to know him better. The Lord meets with people through CBC.

Every year there are projects that need to be done as we extend the legacy that has been given to us. We have a work day April 18th to open the campground for the season. On this day we turn the water and power on and put back together the things that make the camp usable again. The grounds are cleaned up of leaves and sticks, the benches placed outside and the picnic tables moved. This usually happens from 9 AM to noon. Join us if you can. The RV park is open to rental all season. (Go to our website - Conconullybiblecamp.org to rent an RV site.)

We have had many sizable projects in the past like the tabernacle, RV restrooms, new cabins, the lean-to on the dining hall and bringing the water system up to health department standards. This year brings us a new challenge.

This year we are beginning the kitchen upgrade. The Lord has provided some seed money for the project and some expertise in planning and plumbing. We know we will need to hire a contractor to cut concrete to install new drain lines and water lines. The electrical service will need to be worked on and new ovens and other appliances will need to be bought and installed. Please consider donating to help with the cost. If you can't donate to this project remember that prayer is the most valuable asset we have. Make that your contribution by praying for the kitchen and the hands that are preparing it. There will be contractors, plumbers and electricians.

We have known for a long time that we needed to upgrade the old kitchen. The whole system of cooking and washing dishes has had to change over the years just as the old tabernacle and many cabins had to be replaced. God has graciously provided the right people for the work. The Arlington Missions team has been with us for an annual weekend work time since 2014. They have built cabins, sided cabins, painted and added the new lean to the south side of the dining hall last May with the help of Arc Construction. We have seen miracles performed in many of the construction projects and we know God's leading by those miracles. The Arlington Team volunteered when we needed to build new cabins. The tabernacle was built when the sawmill at Oroville had the logs to cut big timbers. A commercial plumber was provided when we had problems with the RV restrooms. Each of these projects showed that God is in charge of timing and expenses. He continues to provide. Praise his Name! Thank you for your support.
